- Visit and meet the requirements of constant study indicated on the platform [aprende.uag.mx](http://aprende.uag.mx)

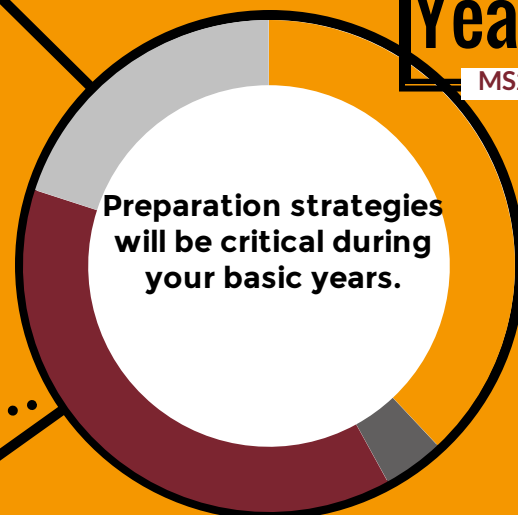
## SERIOUS LEARNING

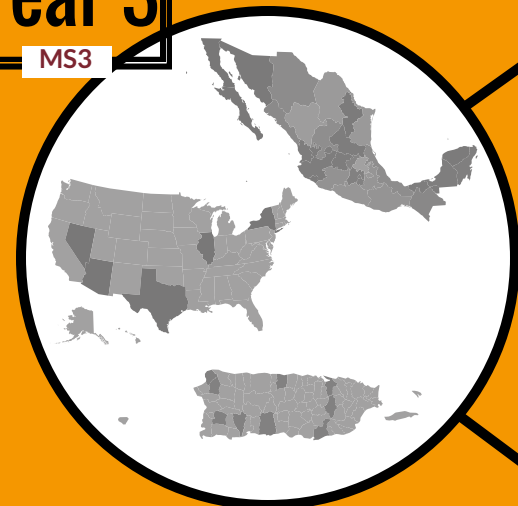

## Recommended Steps to Licensure

### Year 1 & 2

- Focus on your lectures, labs and PMC.
- Start studying for USMLE.
- Register for the USMLE Certification of Identification Form (Form 186).
- Take the Comprehensive Basic Science Self-Assessment (NBME) prepare for USMLE 1.
- We recommend to take your USMLE 1 before moving to the clinical years.
- Explore your options for the clinical years. (check registration and deadlines)

### Year 3 & 4

- Start your clinical rotations.
- Going through rotations may help you decide what area of medicine you want to pursue. Interact with doctors, nurses and other staff. Learning how to work as a team will be invaluable experience.
- Take the Comprehensive Clinical Science Self-Assessment (NBME) prepare for USMLE CK.
- Recommend to finish your USMLE CK and CS before start 8 semester.
- Start registration for Residency.
- Finish UAG medical program. (graduation)

Two years of basic sciences and pass the USMLE Step I. Two years of clinical sciences, pass the USMLE II CK (Clinical Knowledge) and USMLE II CS (Clinical Skills). You'll be awarded a Medical Degree, also known as Titulo de Medico Cirujano. You will become Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) certified. Complete your Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) approved postgraduate residency program and pass USMLE 3, and you will receive your LICENSE. You will become a licensed doctor.
